Welcome to EyeTV!

Thank you for purchasing EyeTV 200. This guide is designed to get you up and running with EyeTV. You will be watching and recording high-quality television shortly.

Open and Unpack Box

The EyeTV 200 box should contain the following items:
• EyeTV 200 hardware
• EyeTV software and PDF product manual
• CD-ROM
• FireWire cable
• Remote control
• AA batteries

Connect EyeTV 200 to a Video Source

EyeTV 200 can be attached to many different video sources. Choose from one of the following:

EyeTV 200 can pick up broadcasts via an antenna:

- Run a coaxial cable from your antenna to the ANT.IN port on the EyeTV 200.
- 2. EyeTV 200 can be directly connected to a cable line, to receive basic (unscrambled/non-encrypted analog) cable:
- Run a coaxial cable from your cable TV port to the ANT.IN port on the EyeTV 200.
- 3. EyeTV 200 can be connected to a cable box or satellite receiver in two ways:
- If your cable box/satellite receiver has audio and video output connectors, attach a stereo audio cable (usually colored red & white) from your equipment's audio outputs to the audio inputs on the EyeTV 200 (labeled L AUDIO R). Connect a yellow composite video cable between the cable box/satellite receiver's video output and the video input on the EyeTV 200. For improved picture quality, use an S-Video cable instead of the composite cable.
- If your cable box/satellite receiver has a RF output, connect a coaxial cable from the cable box/satellite receiver's output to the ANT.IN port on the EyeTV 200. EyeTV will pick up the signal, usually on channel 3 or 4.

Quick Start Guide

Powering EyeTV 200

The EyeTV 200 receives power over the FireWire port. A DC-12V power adapter is optional. You can also chain other bus-powered FireWire devices to the EyeTV 200. Insert the provided AAA batteries into the battery compartment for remote control.

Installing EyeTV Software

Insert the EyeTV CD-ROM. Run the EyeTV application to the Applications folder on your hard disk.

Configuring EyeTV

Run the EyeTV software. The EyeTV setup assistant will start automatically. Please follow the on-screen instructions. During the setup process, you will be asked to select your country. EyeTV needs this information to tune to your channels. Generally, EyeTV is able to automatically detect all the channels available in your area.

Once setup is complete, you can view television or content from another video source via the live TV window. Switch between the tuner input and the S-Video and A/V inputs via the Controls menu.

Use the on-screen remote control to pause or skip through video, or to start a manual recording. Refer to the user's guide for more details on the Internet programming guide and scheduling automated recordings.
